

Helping to Save our Woodlands

These iconic woodlands with their majestic large old trees and native understorey have largely disappeared from south-east Australia.

Funds are now available in the Goulburn Broken catchment to help with their recovery.

We have the remnants of three nationally threatened woodland communities in the Goulburn Broken catchment:

Grey Box Grassy Woodland

White Box - Yellow Box - Blakely's Red Gum Grassy Woodland
Buloke Woodland.

The Federal Government through the Caring for our Country program, has made funds available to help protect and manage these threatened woodlands with their unique bird and animal populations.

Remnants of these woodlands are found scattered across the catchment in both the dryland and irrigation areas.

Funding is available to assist land managers with fencing and revegetation grants, and **stewardship payments via a woodland tender.**
