What we do:

- The Goulburn Broken Catchment Management Authority works in partnership with local communities to protect waterways, landscapes, native species and the natural environment.
- We are one of nine Catchment Management Authorities in Victoria and part of 54 Natural Resource Management Regions in Australia.



Our work includes:



Waterways

Improving river and wetland health through activities such as native fish conservation, managing deliveries of water for the environment, revegetation.



Floodplain Management

Providing flood advice and permits to build flood resilient communities and protect waterways.



Sustainable Irrigation

Promoting best irrigation practice and improving water quality.



Biodiversity and Land Health

Protecting native habitats and threatened species, supporting sustainable agriculture.



Traditional Owners

Working in partnership with the Registered Aboriginal Parties in the catchment, Taungurung Land and Waters Council and Yorta Yorta Nation Aboriginal Corporation, in shared efforts to heal Country.



Community and Partnerships

Working closely with the community and partner organisations to deliver on-ground solutions to environmental issues.

At a glance:

- The Goulburn Broken CMA has more than 25 years experience in natural resource management.
- We work in floodplain management, irrigation, ecology, river health, biodiversity and land health.
- Our offices are located in Shepparton, Benalla and Yea.
- The catchment's two main waterways are the Goulburn River and the Broken River. They provide 11 per cent of the Murray-Darling Basin's water.
- The Goulburn River supports Victoria's largest irrigation system – the Goulburn Murray Irrigation District.
- The catchment is home to more than 220,000 people.
