

Waterway Partnership Proposals Call for Expressions of Interest

GOULBUR BROKEN CATCHMENT MANAGEMENT AUTHORITY

This Expression of Interest (EOI) process aims to enhance riparian condition in urban environments and support community interaction and appreciation of local waterways.

Working in partnership with the community and land managers, the GB CMA will contribute riparian management expertise to the implementation of onground work projects, including but not limited to pest plant control, access enhancement, signage and bank erosion. The intention is to support project works that address key waterway issues and/or that complement other site improvements.

Prioritisation approach

EOI proposals received will be prioritised with consideration to the **environmental outcomes** to be achieved for the waterway as well as **cost share**, **community support** and **longevity** of the project works.

Who can apply?

EOIs are sought from land managers and community groups with capacity to co-fund or offer in-kind labour with complementary activities. Successful proposals will utilise a small budget (around \$20K annually) for GB CMA delivery of coordinated works and engagement events.

Any waterway in an urban environment or public space within the Goulburn Broken catchment is eligible.
