Matt Helder from Dindi Ag will talk about the differences in lime and why a planned lime routine will benefit your pastures. It is good to remember that quality of lime can vary depending on your supplier. The quantity of lime can be established through your soil test results, so bring these along on the day to help you decide on a liming rate the suits your farm.

Greg Bekker from Agriculture Victoria will talk about what you are trying to achieve on your farm and how you can improve your pastures. This can be done in several ways through species selection of your pastures and through adding lime and nutrients. These levels can be identified through a soil test.
