Come along to hear GBCMA Land and Biodiversity Manager Steve Wilson speak about the lives and habits of dunnarts and goannas - iconic native species of the Broken Boosey region. Following these short presentations, Steve will speak about a 'beast' not so common around the Broken Boosey – or in the world for that matter!'

The Javan rhinoceros lives only in a small area of Java, with 63 animals remaining. No Javan rhinos exist in captivity. Steve has been studying the Javan rhino for 3 years for his PhD, and has some fascinating information, stories, photos and footage to share on this intriguing, critically endangered species.
