Come and listen to our guest speakers talk about the importance of paddock trees and how they can benefit your stock and wildlife.

The Importance of a single paddock tree is often underestimated.

A paddock tree can reduce the evaporation of soil moisture and protects pastures: if you have a 20m tall tree in your paddock that tree can divert wind off the paddock for a distance up to 15 times the height of the tree. An individual paddock tree can also:

- create shade and shelter for stock during extreme heat, wind and cold and
- provide homes and food for birds and insects that help pollinate and remove pest insects.
