Biography:

Robert Cook has worked for the Murray Darling Freshwater Research Centre for 13 years and has an honours degree in Environmental Science. He has worked predominantly in the field of macroinvertebrate and floodplain ecology. From 2000 – June 2004 he was co-project leader of the Campaspe Flow Manipulation Project, investigating the role of flow on shrimp and snag macroinvertebrate communities in the Campaspe and Broken Rivers. He has recently begun work on the Broken River component of the CRC for Freshwater Ecology, Lowland River Project, which is investigating the role of slack-water patches in lowland rivers. Areas of interest include macroinvertebrate ecology, flow-habitat-biota relationships and environmental flows.
