What?

This project improves the resilience of four nationally significant ecosystems in the Goulburn Broken Catchment:

- Box-Gum Grassy Woodlands
- Grey Box Woodlands
- Seasonal Herbaceous Wetlands
- Alpine Bogs and wetlands

How?

Improves and protects nationally significant woodland and wetland ecosystems by offering incentives to land managers to create vegetation corridors that connect habitat and provide shelter (eg. during drought) and controlling pest animals and plants.

Who?

Delivered in partnerships between community groups, landholders and Traditional Owners.

Benefits

- Protects nationally significant woodland and wetland ecosystems.
- Builds on, and develops, community and Traditional Owner partnerships to increase natural resource management capacity:
 - 3 Indigenous workers employed
 - 5 community groups supported with employment opportunities (project management)
